MESSAGE FROM OUR LEADERS

Reflecting back on 2021, it was definitely a pivitol year for the Wood Buffalo Sport Connection Society. Formed in June of 2017, the WBSC has been dedicated to sport development in the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo. Since its inception, the WBSC board has been planning and developing the strategic direction to accomplish this mandate thanks to many past board members volunteering their time to setup the current administration for success.

In 2021, the organization hit the ground running. Despite the challenges the COVID-19 pandemic the community, posed for local sports organizations, and everyone on a personal level, the board forged forward to accomplish some major strategic objectives. First and foremost, it was evident that the organization needed to acquire the right Executive Director with dedication to sport as well as the skillset and passion to carry out its mandate. In February of 2021, the board welcomed its new Executive Director, Karly Anderson, to the team. With Karly's drive, the WBSC were able to launch a Road Back to Sport webinar series, orchestrate its 1st Annual Golf Tournament, and create many new partnerships and connections within the community, to name a few. The WBSC was successful in securing a Careers Next Gen and a Canada Summer Student grant allowing us to hire a high school and college student who worked diligently on getting our website and social media platforms launched as well as many other tasks.

The WBSC, from a financial lense, collected more of its CIP grant funding in 2021 which was used to advance our objectives. Because of the partnerships with the Oil Barons and Kids Sport, the other grants mentioned above, and our great sponsors of our Golf Tournament, we brought in more revenue than was spent keeping us moving on the correct trajectory.

Our objectives for 2022, 2023, and beyond will be strengthening our membership, fundraising, working on inclusivity in sport, as well as keeping connected with and advocating for the sports organizations and our community needs in sport. As we are closing the gaps outlined for us by the RMWB in our funding contract, it is also imperative that we collaborate with our partners, sport organizations, and our community to identify new challenges to focus our efforts.


